Beijing Finance Street, Beijing, China.
Large-scale, mixed-use development totaling 8.6-million sf in the heart of Beijing. Complex will contain residential, hotel, conference center, retail, cultural, and office elements. The centerpiece of the development will be a "Great Urban Atrium," to attract visitors regardless of time of day or year.

Environmental graphics, wayfinding, and street furniture for the BFS development.

Greater Beijing Finance Street City Master Plan, Beijing, China. A new master plan reexamining the potential for the greater BFS district.

Jianianhua Building; Chongqing, China.
Transparent glass building whose precise geometry anchors the adjacent plaza and park. The façade serves as a continuously changing billboard through a series of movable triangular panels.

Knowledge and Innovation Community Hub Complex, Shanghai, China. Four mixed-use development buildings for the new University City district within Shanghai's Yang Pu District. First stage will feature office, retail, and learning-center uses, integrated with two landscaped plazas and a transit corridor, to create a commercial center of activity for the district.

Shanghai Waterfront Redevelopment Masterplan, Shanghai, China. The master plan's main priorities are to reconnect the city to the river and to extend the image of the Bund to the entire riverfront. Key strategies include devoting the majority of the riverfront to open space connected to the existing regional open space network.

Jinmen Jinta, Tianjin, China. This design proposal organizes the site by a unifying set of building relationships that signify the identity of the place as the true and timeless center of Tianjin's commercial and recreational activity.
